BIRD TECH TALK

By Martin Bierman "My hood won't open."



Question - A 1955 T-Bird owner can't open his hood. **Answer-** This problem usually occurs due to a broken hood release cable which breaks on pulling to open the hood. The only solution to this is to move the hood release lever from

under the car. The lever is located on the driver side of the hood release bar just below the starter solenoid. The car will

need to be on a lift or raised up on jack stands. One can reach up to the release lever on the hood release bar and move it toward the firewall with a long bar, screwdriver or the special tool sold by Classic Auto Supply

Company (CASCO) (See figure 1 & 2). Be careful that a tool does not touch the starter solenoid lug where the battery cable is attached.

The passenger side of the hood release bar is more accessible between the heater box and the right exhaust manifold and there is more room to reach the bar. Attach a Vice Grip to it (Figure 3) and then pull down, moving the bar toward the firewall.

It helps to have a second person pushing down on the hood at the corner when trying to release the hood. A wire coat hanger or a steel wire cable can be fed under the dash to the hood release lever to serve as an emergency hood release if the hood release cable should break in the future.

As all Temples in the network of the North American Shrine Tangier Temple had the basic parade units, consisting of foot patrols, bands, motorcycles and convertibles. In 1975, three members of Tangier Temple conceived the idea of organizing a new parade unit consisting of the 1955, 1956 and 1957 Ford Thunderbird roadsters. The T-Bird Classics officially became a parade unit of Tangier Temple in 1976. The original by-laws were written to allow for a membership of 18. So much interest was generated in this new unit that in 1979 the by-laws were updated to allow for membership of 24.

The T-Bird Classics are the only unit in the network of North American Shrine exclusively displaying the 1955 through 1957 Thunderbird.
